Minutes Resource Stewardship subcommittee Tuesday, February 6, 2024, 4:30 PM Zoom

1) Workplan Draft 2025 – See below.

The workplan for 2025 was discussed. The group felt that funding levels could remain the same as those of the current budget year. Current carryover is noted.

2) Invasive Plant Management

Betsy Corrigan may be able to work for FRCC as an employee of her new company.

3) Water Quality Monitoring

Water quality reports will be presented at the February full committee meeting.

4) Land Protection/ Grants

No Land Protection grants have been received. **Dr. Carole Cheah has submitted a request to release 5000 beetles to control HWA in 2024 at a cost of \$12,625.50.** Andrew moved to approve the request and Laura seconded. The motion passed unanimously. (It should be noted that Dr. Cheah submitted a very thorough report on the success of last year's project. It was suggested that the contract stipulates that a report would be required for this year's results as well.

FALPS submitted a request for \$10,000 to purchase 25 trees for the People's Forest 100th anniversary celebration. Roger stated that they may not actually need the full \$10,000 so **Laura made a motion was made to award up to \$10,000** for the purchase of the **25 trees**. Andrew seconded. The motion passed unanimously. DEEP will provide the labor and expertise for this project.

5) Culverts

The contract for the Hartland culvert design work is awaiting a signature.

6) Others: Continuing/New

West River Road Project:
